Further, as a preventive step to discourage any potential misuse and to support the smooth and fair conduct of the examination process, it has been decided that leave shall not be granted to students on 2nd May and 3rd May 2026. Requests for leave during these dates will only be considered under exceptional circumstances and must be supported with valid justification and appropriate documentation. All students are expected to cooperate fully and uphold the highest standards of discipline and integrity.


